Business of the Month

Southern Illinois **Underwriters Agency, Inc.**

Southern Illinois Underwriters Agency, Inc., owned by Adrian S. Rogier and C. William Schmidt, is the April 2014 Edwardsville/Glen Carbon Chamber of Commerce Business of the Month.

Southern Illinois Underwriters Agency was established in 1929 as its predecessor agencies, Schmidt-Phillipe & Associates and Rogier Insurance Agency (of Highland Illinois), respectively. Southern Illinois Underwriters Agency was formed by a merger of these two agencies in 1986.

The company's core product is insurance – commercial, personal lines, health and benefits, and they classify themselves as general practitioners of the insurance profession, meaning they look to serve a broad market that includes anyone with a need for insurance expertise.

When asked what makes his company outstanding, Schmidt responded, "We feel were are more experienced in the commercial lines area than most agencies, but our personal lines expertise is also very strong between our three offices in Edwardsville, Highland and Greenville."

"Both my partner and myself are third generation owners dating back to 1929 for both agencies prior to our formation of Southern Illinois Underwriters Agency. We share a passion for wanting to help people, help them to protect the largest asset/s that they may ever acquire," Schmidt shared.

As a business that has been in existence for 85 years, the company has seen many changes throughout the decades on which Bill elaborated. "Automation has been the largest change since I started in 1974. Our first computer system in 1981, the file server was the size of a large double door refrigerator, now it is the size of a suitcase. When fax machines came along later, we wondered how we ever got along without them, now they are almost dinosaurs with the advent of scanning and emailing. Let's not even talk about car phones versus smart phones – what a change! With the assistance of technology, we plan to continue growing and servicing our existing and future clients."

Schmidt has served the community in many capacities. He was a member of the Edwardsville YMCA board of directors for 20 years (1987–2007); president of the YMCA in 2000-2001; and represented Region 2 of The Independent Insurance Agents of Illinois, the profession's state association, as their regional vice president from 2005–2009.

Finally, Schmidt shared the company's long tradition of Ed/Glen Chamber membership. Southern Illinois Underwriters Agency has been a member since 1954, first as Oscar Schmidt Insurance, then Chuck Schmidt Insurance, and then Schmidt-Phillipe & Associates. Bill Phillipe, Schmidt's former partner, served as Ed/Glen Chamber president in the mid '70s, and Bill was a board member in the '80s.

"Being a member of the Edwardsville/Glen Carbon Chamber of Commerce has allowed us to grow and become better business people by interacting with our fellow chamber members," Schmidt added.

Illinois Chamber, Lt. Governor & NIU **Plan Comprehensive Military Study**

Working in partnership with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce Foundation, Lt. Governor Sheila Simon recently announced that the Northern Illinois University's Center for Governmental Studies (CGS) will conduct a comprehensive economic impact analysis of active military bases in Illinois.

"This study will provide the information we need to retain our military bases, promote our great facilities and encourage Illinois job growth," said Simon, chair of the Interagency Military Base Support & Economic Development Committee. "I am pleased to partner with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce Foundation to protect our military assets and grow our defense industry."

NIU researchers will calculate the economic impact of the state's military installations and provide the data needed for congressional, state and business leaders to protect Illinois' military economy at a time of federal defense spending cuts, forced reallocations and base realignment or closure. The final report is due in October.

"We're excited to take the next step in this process. CGS has a diverse portfolio of economic research that we know will help us understand the economic impact of our defense installations and defense industry on our economy," said Benjamin Brockschmidt, director of federal affairs with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce.

Founded in 1969, CGS is a public policy unit at Northern Illinois University that assembles interdisciplinary teams from its own professional staff and across the university to work with government at all levels, non-profit organizations, school districts, community colleges, park districts, library districts, land conservation districts, land developers, health care agencies, and utilities.

As chair of the IMBSEDC, Simon helps coordinate the state's activities and communications relating to current and former military bases in Illinois. Simon is committed to protecting the state's military operations, installations, and the families of those who selflessly serve our state and country.


