### **JSC Unveils Boundless Playground Design**

The Junior Service Club of Edwardsville/Glen Carbon unveils design plans for their Boundless Playground project. The Boundless Playground which will be located in Township Park, Edwardsville, is scheduled for a community build weekend in April 2013. Over the last two years, the local service group has raised a total of \$375,000 for this \$450,000 playground.

"What makes our playaround unique, is that it meets a distinct need in the community. It creates a space for kids and adults with a physical disability to come out and play," says Kristi Hyten, a physical therapist and member of the project planning committee. Kelly Schlechte, Junior Service Club President, reports that "The Junior Service Boundless Playground will be 80% accessible to persons with disabilities, where as a traditional playground is usually only required to be about 20% accessible."

The Boundless Playground which centers around a custom-made tree structure will be completely wheelchair accessible featuring double wide ramps to the tallest slides and towers, adapted swings and equipment, sensory stimulation activities and easily negotiable terrain.

## 8-Year-Old First Clover Leaf Bank Scavenger **Hunt Winner Gifts Cash to Young Cancer Patient**

What started as a scavenger hunt at First Clover Leaf Bank (FCLB) in Edwardsville turned into \$2,000 raised for a local child with leukemia, thanks to the efforts of 8-year-old Wyatt Erber. Erber and his mother Noelle worked as partners throughout the FCLB scavenger hunt, checking Facebook for clues and visiting local businesses such as Annie's Frozen Custard to be the first team to complete the hunt and receive the \$1,000 grand prize.

The scavenger hunt began early in the summer, just a few short days after their neighbors, Trisha & Jim Kielty, had received the devastating news that 2-year-old daughter Cara had been diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia. The diagnosis hit home in a neighborhood where neighbors had already banded together in previous years to work with Cookies for Kids' Cancer, a non-profit organization committed to raising funds for pediatric cancer research.

As soon as his mother asked Wyatt if he would like to join her in the scavenger hunt, he knew what he wanted to do. "Wyatt said, 'Yeah, let's do it, and if we win, we could give the money to Cara to help her," Noelle Erber recalled.

"I didn't really know what I would've done with it," Wyatt Erber explained. "And I knew what they could've done with it that would've really (been) a big help for them."

Initially, the idea that an 8-year-old boy would willingly choose to donate those funds to her family was hard for Trisha Kielty to comprehend. "Honestly, I was hoping they wouldn't win," Kielty explained. "It's hard. He's 8, and he worked hard for this. I don't want to take money from a kid; I want him to go out and spend it. But I was told, without a doubt, that this was absolutely what he was doing. So I decided, all right, that's fine – we're going to accept it with open arms and realize that he's just that great of a kid."

Upon hearing about Erber's generosity, the Edwardsville Neighbors in Need organization stepped up to match the prize money the third grader had already won from First Clover Leaf Bank. "Wyatt's generosity to his neighbor really touched our hearts," Kathie Opel, one of the founding members of Neighbors in Need, explained. "That really encompasses what we would like to do as an organization – help our neighbors who are suffering."

Neighbors in Need is a non-profit organization that works to help anyone in Edwardsville District 7 experiencing a recent medical crisis who finds themselves in need of some additional assistance to get by. In the past, the organization has helped with rent or medical costs, gaining most of its funding from its annually held events, the Turkey Trot and the Taste of Edwardsville. ### **Mr. Handyman Donates** 15 Hours of Work

A local company observed the anniversary of the Sept. 11 attacks by helping victims of another form of violence that impacts people even closer to home - domestic abuse.



B.J. Meyers, owner Handyman of Metro-East, located

in Edwardsville, arranged for three of her workmen to volunteer at the Oasis Women's Center in Alton Monday, a day in advance of the Sept. 11th National Day of Service & Remembrance. "We called the shelter to see if they could use some help a couple of weeks ago," Meyers said. "Tina (Culp, household coordinator) gave us a list of repair requests, which are not a big deal for us but all are things they wanted done and couldn't do themselves."

Meyers' team was busy throughout the shelter, adding a new light fixture in a room dedicated solely to mothers, hanging curtains in a play area, adding a new wall and shelving to a kitchen closet and covering a pipe in the children's observed playroom. "Once I talked to Tina, who was so enthused, we were happy to do this for the shelter," Meyers explained. "These guys love finding a solution; just give them something to do and they'll go at it."

All of the shelter's clients have suffered from domestic violence, and all are working on making a fresh start, she explained. "The children have experienced all that their mothers have been through," Culp noted. "These lovely repairs help our clients feel special – that they matter – because someone has come in to do something like this for them." Coincidentally, Culp said the group's generosity has helped lift the spirits of our staff.

Meyers also observed that it might be important for clients to begin viewing men as good people who are willing to help them embark on a better life. On average, the shelter houses 10 families.

The crew donated approximately 15 total hours and the cost of materials to the center worth about \$750, Meyers said. "We wanted to do more for them. We are always looking for ways to give back to our community and we are excited to be a part of a national operation to help those in need."
